Views from the Terrace

DEAR RESIDENTS of the TERRACE:

As we read the details of the COVID-19 pandemic, we tend to be concerned at how it could spread all over the world in such a short time. We cannot imagine that since last March, this dreaded disease has caused over 5,900 deaths in Ontario, and a total of 19,500 deaths in all of Canada.

In an effort to bring this virus under control, Premier Ford has declared firm <u>stay at home</u> rules. The <u>no visiting</u> and <u>no visitors</u> instructions hardly leave any questions.

We respect E.T. management's efforts to help contain the spreading of the COVID outbreak here in the building by stating that all of us should limit the times that we leave our suites to as few as possible. We are to avoid visiting with other residents. We have been instructed to always keep a distance of 6 feet or 2 metres away from those people we do not live with. This is especially important to remember when we use the elevators. There are to be no more than two passengers in one elevator at a time. I am sure that all of us are in the habit of washing our hands every time we exit and enter our suite. It also makes perfect sense to limit the number of personal support workers who come to E.T. to help those residents who need help, so that they can continue to live independently for as long as possible. It is also a wise decision of management to stipulate that Personal Care Workers must sign in and out as they come to help those residents who need their services. By now, all of us are used to the fact that we must always put on our face mask before we leave our suite, even for small tasks, such as picking up our mail or taking out our garbage.

But instead of looking at all our present restrictions, let us also count our blessings of our present, restricted situation. We are retired; we do not have to go to work or be in the office on time five days a week, and we do not have to be in the company of customers or co-workers all day long.

Self-isolating could lead to loneliness, but it also protects us from being exposed to people who have been exposed to COVID. They may have the virus in its early stages, but although they do not have the symptoms, they can already pass it on to others.

In times like these we are assured that we are not alone. God is with us always. We find real encouragement in the words of **2 Timothy 1:7** (NKJV)

For God has not given us the spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.


